Habakkuk 2:5-17

"Moreover, wine is a traitor, an arrogant man who is never at rest. His greed is as wide as Sheol; like death he has never enough. He gathers for himself all nations and collects as his own all peoples."

Woe to the Chaldeans

⁶ Shall not all these take up their taunt against him, with scoffing and riddles for him, and say, "Woe to him who heaps up what is not his own—for how long?—and loads himself with pledges!"

⁷ Will not your debtors suddenly arise, and those awake who will make you tremble?  - Shrewdness is not shadiness. Be strategically wise but morally blameless as doves (Matthew 10:16).
 - o Tainted profits cannot bring safety.
 - Crooked conquest cannot erase guilt.

Q: How does profitable vice betray us?

A: ¹³ Behold, is it not from the Lord of hosts that peoples labor merely for fire, and nations weary themselves for nothing?

"Evil's inherent tendency is to self-destruct." – J.N.B. Heflin¹

A: It ends in losing your personal peace, family health, soul, and often the stuff you sacrificed everything for: Money, power, and fame.

How do you turn the corner?

- Pursue genuine glory by seeking God's glory 2:14 For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.
 - Allow this future reality to influence your day-to-day decisions.

What does this response to God's grace look like?

- Repent and say "Yes" to Jesus.
- Be baptized by immersion in obedience to Jesus.
- Join a local Bible-teaching church.
- Tell others about Jesus.
- Be quick to forgive and admit when you're wrong.
- Live in generosity.
